Scott E. Augenbaum is the supervisor of the FBI's Memphis Division Cyber Squad, based in Nashville, TN. Supervisory Special Agent Augenbaum manages the Memphis Crimes Against Children Task Force and formed a Joint Cyber Crime Task Force with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and Franklin, TN Police Department to investigate Computer Intrusion, Online Child Exploitation, Intellectual Property Rights and Internet Fraud. Augenbaum joined the FBI in 1988; after the September 11th attacks, Augenbaum created an ad-hoc task force of Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies which lead to the formation of the Joint Terrorism Task Force in Syracuse, New York. In December 2003, Augenbaum was promoted to a Supervisory Special Agent at FBIHQ, Cyber Division. Augenbaum also had Program Management responsibilities for the FBI's Intellectual Property Rights Program and maintained liaison with the industry partners on IPR issues. Augenbaum graduated from the City College of New York in 1992 and worked on his Master of Business Administration (MBA) in Information Technology and Finance at Fordham University's Lincoln Center Campus, New York, NY.

A.J. Bahou is a registered patent attorney who practices in the area of intellectual property law, including strategic management of patents, copyrights, trademarks and trade secrets. He has extensive experience in all aspects of patent infringement litigation, from pre-complaint investigation through trial and appeal. Mr. Bahou is currently Vice president and Chief Intellectual Property Officer for Prism Technologies where he enforces, litigates and licenses Prism's IP rights. Mr. Bahou holds a JD and LLM in IP from Franklin Pierce Law Center.

Lane R. Belisomo is an Associate in the Business Services Group of Butler Snow in Memphis. Ms. Belisomo practices in the areas of business structures, transactions, intellectual property and technology and trademark law. Ms. Belisomo holds a JD from the University of Mississippi.
